

The Midwestern Region of the National Black Law Students Association (MWBLSA) is currently accepting submissions from employers for its Midwest Region Career Fair/Resume Collection. The virtual event will help connect NBLSA law students and alumni with prospective employers for both summer and permanent positions. This is an excellent opportunity for prospective employers to recruit exceptional law students from across the nation.

The purpose of MWBLSA is to articulate and promote the educational, professional, political, and social needs and goals of Black law students in the Midwest (Montana, Wyoming, North Dakota, South Dakota, Nebraska, Kansas, Minnesota, Iowa, Missouri, Wisconsin, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Ohio, and Michigan). While this Program is being hosted by the Midwest Region, dues-paying NBLSA members from any region can participate. Employers will receive applications from students at law schools across the country. The Career Fair/Resume Collection is part of their 53rd Annual Convention which will take place from February 3–7, 2021.

Employers will register for the resume collection and designation what additional materials they want students to submit (i.e. cover letter, transcript, writing sample). Students then will apply and submit all of the requested materials.

Once logged in to Symplicity, select OCI from the left-hand side menu → schedule request → request a schedule → for session select 2021 MWBLSA Career Fair → fill out the relevant information and click Submit.

On February 4th employers will receive a packet with the information of all interested applicants. Employers can then schedule interviews with student candidates of interest on their own schedule and timeline.
