**JOB POSTING:
Juvenile Justice Compliance Officer**

POST DATE: August 1, 2012

Qualifications:

An eligible applicant must be an attorney licensed to practice law in the United States with at least three years of specific experience in the defense of juveniles in delinquency proceedings or possess a Master's Degree in Public Administration with at least five years of progressively responsible experience conducting organizational assessments. All applicants should have expertise in matters of performance evaluation development and implementation. If licensed as an attorney in a state other than Louisiana, the employee must become licensed as an attorney in this state within one year of being employed by the Board. An eligible applicant must also be a U.S. citizen, become a domiciliary of Louisiana who is registered to vote in Louisiana, and be available to work full-time in the state's Baton Rouge office.

Duties:

The Juvenile Justice Compliance Officer is a full-time, executive-level staff position with the State of Louisiana. Responsibilities include:

- Develop evaluation protocols to assess district compliance with Board-adopted standards and guidelines related to juvenile delinquency representation;
- Develop and implement an effective evaluation implementation plan that allows for regular assessments and ongoing monitoring of juvenile defense services, statewide, and appropriately coordinated with the Trial Level Compliance Officer's duties and workplan;
- Support the Deputy Defender – Director of Juvenile Defender Services in the development and implementation of the agency's strategic plan related to juvenile justice;
- Provide direct oversight of regular assessments and ongoing monitoring of juvenile defense representation; and
- Perform all other duties assigned by the State Public Defender.

Compensation:

Compensation is salaried and commensurate with experience. Employment with the State of Louisiana includes full health benefits and enrollment in the State of Louisiana Retirement

System. The Louisiana Public Defender Board encourages professional development and supports these opportunities for its staff.
