Here is the information I sent Norm several months ago:

As a point of comparison, the Department of Justice (DOJ), where 75 percent of full-time equivalents (FTEs) are committed to criminal work, had an appropriation of nearly \$31,000,000 and 53 FTEs for legal education in FY 2012, or five times what the Committee authorized for Defender Services. That \$31,000,000 does not include the training funds for staff at the FBI, DEA, BOP, ATF or other DOJ entities. The Defender Services Office (DSO) Training Division (TD) has 11 authorized FTEs [Note that the number of FTEs has now been increased to 13].

Attached is the information comparing FY 2012 and 2014 funding for DOJ's legal - for which there was approximately a \$2 million increase:
