


U.S. State and Federal Prison Population

The number of youth held in juvenile justice facilities fell from a peak of 109,000 in 2000 to 25,000 in 2020— <u>a 77% decline.</u>



The prison population serving a life sentence today is <u>larger than the total</u> <u>prison population in</u> <u>1970.</u>


